The Arizona State Board of Massage Therapy ("Board") held a Formal Administrative Hearing on Monday, June 28, 2021 at 9:00 a.m. in the matter of Fabian Garcia, LMT. Seamus Monaghan, Assistant Attorney General, appeared on behalf of the State of Arizona. Mary D. Williams, Assistant Attorney General, appeared as independent advice counsel for the Board. The Respondent was present telephonically. Following the presentation of the State's and the Respondent's cases in chief, the Board moved to adopt the State's following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and issues this Order for Revocation of licensure.

## **FINDINGS OF FACT**

- 1. The Arizona State Board of Massage Therapy is the duly constituted agency for licensing and regulating of the practice of massage therapy in the State of Arizona and has jurisdiction over Respondent as a licensee of the Board and the subject matter pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-4201, et seq.
- 2. Respondent was the holder of License Number 23968 which enabled him to practice respiratory care in the State of Arizona, prior to this Order.
- 3. On September 3, 2020, the Board received a complaint from DS. The complaint alleged that the Respondent committed several violations towards DS while she was receiving massage therapy services from the Respondent at Elements Massage on Camelback Rd in Phoenix, on September 1, 2020.
- 4. The complaint specifically alleged that towards the end of the massage session while DS was lying in the prone position, the Respondent began massaging her left leg and

working toward her inner thigh where he then removed the sheet from her lower half exposing DS's buttocks. He then proceeded to pull her underwear down below her buttocks.

- 5. The complaint further alleges that after the Respondent removed the sheet and her underwear exposing her buttocks, he then inserted his right hand between DS's thighs, resting his fingertips on her vulva while lifting her pelvic region up. The Respondent then used his fingertips to massage DS's vulva in a circular and pulsating rhythm, while asking her if she wanted him to go "deeper". DS asked the Respondent to move back to her hips in an attempt to move him away from her vulva, however, the Respondent went right back to applying a circular pulsating pressure to DS's vulva.
- 6. DS stated that when the Respondent moved back to her vulva for a second time she again requested he apply pressure to her hips and the Respondent snapped DS's underwear back into place and abruptly ended the 90 minute session ten minutes early. DS noted that during the whole time that the Respondent was attempting to massage her vulva, he did not once massage her left leg, which was the body part he was supposed to be working on at the time. During the Board's March 29, 2021, meeting DS was present telephonically and explained that she felt that the Respondent knew exactly what he was doing when he was massaging her vulva, as she was actually stimulated by his technique.
- 7. Within two hours of the incident DS reported what happened to the Respondent's employer. Within 5 hours of the alleged conduct DS reported the incident to the Phoenix Police Department and by the end of the day had filed a complaint with the Arizona Board of Massage Therapy. DS's story has been consistent throughout this process.
- 8. The Respondent did not indicate anything abnormal occurring during the massage in his SOAP notes for the appointment in question and per the Phoenix Police Department Incident Report dated September 18, 2020, the Respondent's employer indicated that she spoke with the Respondent only after receiving a call from DS two hours after the incident. There is no indication that the Respondent alerted his employer to any abnormal occurrence before being approached by the employer regarding the incident. Although Respondent did not indicate

anything abnormal in his SOAP notes or report anything out of the ordinary to his employer following the massage, he indicated in his response to the complaint that DS was making "noises of pleasure and satisfaction," and that it was DS who requested and wanted the Respondent to move back to massaging her inner thighs.

9. At its March 29, 2021, meeting the Board voted to move this matter forward to formal hearing possible revocation of the Respondent's license to practice massage therapy in the state of Arizona.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Board possesses jurisdiction over the subject matter and over Respondent pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-4201 *et seq*.
- 2. The conduct and circumstances described above constitute grounds for discipline pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-4253 (A)(10), which states, "engaging in conduct that could harm the public."
- 3. The conduct and circumstances described above constitute grounds for discipline pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-4253(A)(14), which states, "Engaging in the performance of substandard care by a massage therapist due to a deliberate or negligent act or failure to act, regardless of whether actual injury to the person cared for is established."
- 4. The conduct and circumstances described above constitute grounds for discipline pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-4253(A)(16), which states, "failing to adhere to the recognized standards and ethics of the massage therapy profession."
- 5. The conduct and circumstances described above constitute grounds for discipline pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-4253(A)(23), which states, "violating Board statutes, rules, or orders."

#### **ORDER**

Based upon the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT License No. 23968 issued to Respondent shall be REVOKED on the effective date of this Order.

The effective date of this order is the date which it is signed by the Boards Executive Director on behalf of the Board.

### **NOTICE**

In order to be eligible for judicial review pursuant to Title 12, Chapter 7, Article 6, you are required to exhaust your administrative remedies by filing a motion for rehearing or review of the Board's decision within thirty-five days after these Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order are mailed to you at your last known address, or thirty days after they are personally served upon you. Pursuant to A.R.S. § 41-1092.09(B), you are notified that failure to file a motion for rehearing or review in writing at the Board's office by that date has the effect of prohibiting you from seeking judicial review of the Board's decision.
