

1 3. Respondent affirmatively agrees that this Consent Agreement shall be
2 irrevocable.

3 4. Respondent understands that this Consent Agreement or any part of the
4 agreement may be considered in any future disciplinary action by the Board against her.

5 5. Respondent understands this Consent Agreement deals with Board case
6 number 18-113 involving allegations that Respondent engaged in conduct that would
7 subject her to discipline under the Board's statutes and rules. The investigation into these
8 allegations against Respondent shall be concluded upon the Board's adoption of this
9 Consent Agreement.

10 6. Respondent understands that this Consent Agreement does not constitute a
11 dismissal or resolution of any other matters currently pending before the Board, if any,
12 and does not constitute any waiver, express or implied, of the Board's statutory authority
13 or jurisdiction regarding any other pending or future investigation, action or proceeding.

14 7. Respondent also understands that acceptance of this Consent Agreement
15 does not preclude any other agency, subdivision, or officer of this State from instituting
16 any other civil or criminal proceedings with respect to the conduct that is the subject of
17 this Consent Agreement.

18 8. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that, upon signing this Consent
19 Agreement and returning this document to the Board's Executive Director, she may not
20 revoke her acceptance of the Consent Agreement or make any modifications to the
21 document regardless of whether the Consent Agreement has been signed by the
22 Executive Director. Any modification to this original document is ineffective and void
23 unless mutually agreed by the parties in writing.

24 9. This Consent Agreement is effective only when signed by the Executive
25 Director on behalf of the Board.

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1 maintain the requirements for an original license under A.R.S. § 32-4222(A)), namely,
2 failing to maintain good moral character and conviction of a felony.

3 2. The conduct and circumstances described above in Factual Allegations
4 constitute grounds for discipline pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-4253(A)(4) (being convicted of
5 a felony or other offense involving moral turpitude or any conviction for prostitution,
6 solicitation or another similar offense. A conviction by a court of competent jurisdiction
7 is conclusive evidence of the commission of the crime).

8 3. The conduct and circumstances described above in Factual Allegations
9 constitute grounds for discipline pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-4253(A)(6) (engaging in any act
10 or practice in violation of this chapter or any board rule).

11 4. The conduct and circumstances described above in Factual Allegations
12 constitute grounds for discipline pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-4253(A)((10) (engaging in
13 conduct that could result in harm or injury to the public).

14 5. The conduct and circumstances described above in Factual Allegations
15 constitute grounds for discipline pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-4253(A)(16) (failing to adhere
16 to the recognized standards and ethics of the massage therapy profession).

17 6. The conduct and circumstances described above in Factual Allegations
18 constitute grounds for discipline pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-3208 (requiring health
19 professionals to disclose certain criminal charges to the Board within ten days).

20 7. The Board possesses statutory authority to enter into a consent agreement
21 with a massage therapist to accept the surrender of a license if the licensee admits to
22 having committed an act which would subject her to discipline under the Board's statutes
23 or rules. A.R.S. § 32-4254(N)(2).

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
1 **ORDER**
